Rules and Regulations

The Saline Fair Horse Show (SFHS) and the Saline Fair (SF) welcome you to these events. Please review the following rules regarding the shows.

The Youth Shows on Tuesday through Sunday will follow the Michigan Interscholastic Horsemen's Association Rules (www.miha.org) and the Weekend Open shows will follow 4-H Current Rules. Rule Books for both will be available in the show office for review.

Directions to the Washtenaw County Farm Council Grounds
I-94 (Ann Arbor). Exit Ann Arbor-Saline Road. Go south
toward Saline. At STOP SIGN (Wagner Road), turn left.
Council grounds are past the next stoplight on the left. Please
park in designated areas ONLY, other events may be in progress
on the show grounds. Address is 5055 Ann Arbor-Saline Road;

High Point, where applicable, is one horse, one rider, per division, per age group. Daily High Point is counted from the time the daily \$5.00 fee is paid. All age division classes count towards Daily High Point unless otherwise noted.

High Point System (regardless of number of entries):			
1st Place: 8 Points	2nd Place: 7 Points	3rd Place: 6 Points	4th Place: 5 Points
5th Place: 4 Points	6th Place: 3 Points	7th Place: 2 Point	8th Place: 1 Points

All 4-H rules apply, regardless of rider's age, except where otherwise noted. God's name is to be honored. Honesty and Sportsmanship are expected of all participants and spectators.

No alcoholic beverages are permitted on fairgrounds.

Saline Fair Horse Show and the Saline Fair asks that you clean up around your area, stalls and/or trailers. Stalled horses must have current telephone numbers for owners, their Veterinarian Name and telephone number posted on the stall door at all times. For safety reason, please assure that each stalled horse has two buckets of clean water before you leave the grounds for the evening.

Proper attire is required for all classes with the exception of speed events. Requirements for speed classes include long pants, a shirt with a minimum of a 4-inch sleeve, and boots with a minimum ½-inch heel. Speed will follow all other 4-H rules and regulations. SFHS and SF require helmets be worn by riders 18 years and under while riding on the grounds and in the make-up area. Speed riders that compete in Trail can compete in speed attire without penalty provided they follow the above clothing requirements. Speed horses in speed bits and speed tack are allowed to compete in Trail without penalty. Hitting the entrance gate with the horse during Speed events will be cause for disqualification from that class. Polo wraps on horses are not allowed during Speed events.

ANSI or SEI helmets are recommended; hunt caps are allowed in the appropriate Hunt Seat classes.

Jr. Horse age is 5 & under as of 12/31 current year.

Rider age is determined as of 1/01/2011. You must ride in your own age group, no crossovers will be allowed.

Current year negative coggins test must be presented for all horses on the show grounds, whether or not they are being shown.

SFHS reserves the right to cancel, split, or combine classes at any time. Sign-up for desired classes must be done TWO full classes in advance. When the gate is closed, the class has started. It is the rider's responsibility to be ready for their class.

Judges' decisions are final. Participants and spectators, when outside the ring may have no contact with the judge. All complaints must be made in writing to the Board of Officers for review. Absolutely no refunds will be issued. Classes cancelled due to inclement weather will not be rescheduled or refunded. In the event of a cancelled event, there will be NO double pointing of classes at subsequent events.
